HILDEGARD OF BINGEN PILGRIMAGE

This year, Garratt Publishing's 2024 Lent Calendar is taking you on the *Hildegard of Bingen Pilgrimage Trail*.

Hildegard (c1098–1179), who lived her entire life in the area now known as the Rhineland-Palatine region of Germany, is probably the most famous person from the Middle Ages. Not only was she known for her visionary theology (Hildegard stated she first experienced visions as a toddler) she was also an abbess, poet, theologian, composer, naturalist, scientific and medicinal writer, and healer. The fascination with Hildegard of Bingen's life and work remains great to this day.

The 135-kilometre pilgrimage takes you through the land on which Hildegard lived and includes a series of *Meditation Tableaux* (accompanied by Hildegard's music) and *Information Tableaux* that provide information about Hildegard as a person, her work, and her life.

IDAR-OBERSTEIN

Idar-Oberstein, situated in the Nahe Valley is known as Germany's gemstone capital – and the birthplace of actor Bruce Willis! Various museums invite you to explore the gemstones that have been mined and processed here over the centuries. It is at the *German Mineral Museum* that you will find the *Information Tableau* – *Stones* which refers to Hildegard's book of stones. Her book details the healing effects of the stones on people, rather than about the stones themselves.

CHURCH IN THE ROCKS

230 steps above Idar-Oberstein is the cliffhanging *Felsenkirche*, also known as the *Church in the Rocks*. Built between 1482 and 1484, it houses a Gothic baptism stone, a historic organ that dates to 1756 and a crucifix made of naturallygrown agate. On the pedestrian path to the chapel is the *Meditation Tableau – The Seeress*.

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HERRSTEIN

This beautiful medieval town has won many awards for its successful renovation. It was first settled after the building of Herrstein Castle in the late 13th century by the Counts of Sponheim. However, it did not gain village and town market rights until 1428. A **Meditation Tableau – God Enthroned** is located in front of the old Protestant Castle Church and an **Information Tableau – The County of Sponheim** can be found in the historic town centre.

NIEDERHOSENBACH

Niederhosenbach is believed to be the birthplace of Hildegard. The theme of the **Information Tableau – Hildegard's Origin** is Hildegard's descent from a noble family. This Protestant church houses a facsimile edition of the major mystical work that brought Hildegard's fame, *Scivias*. Near the church is an old oak tree and a place for meditation – the perfect place for the **Meditation Tableau – Creation and the Fall**.

BERGEN

The Hildegard von Bingen Pilgrimage Trail passes through the delightful town of Bergen whose townscape is dominated by the large Protestant church with its 43m tower. A pilgrim station is located the pension and guesthouse *Toskana im Hunsrück* where the *Meditation Tableau - The Cosmos* can be found.

TRÜBENBACHTAL

The trail from Bergen takes you through the romantic Trübenbachtal valley. Trübenbachtal is a beautiful, natural area with mosses, ferns, oak, ash and hornbeam trees, with the added surprise of a small waterfall! Along the trail there is the **Information Tableau - Birds** which references Hildegard's book on birds and winged animals.

KIRN

Kirn's landmark, the Kyrburg, sits boldy above the city and was built in 926. However, the town itself dates back to 841. Located in the Protestant western part of Naheland, it is fitting that the Information Tableau – Hildegard as an Early 'Protestant' is placed here. Once known for its tanneries and leather-finishing plants (which are now long gone), the town is now known for its locally brewed beer, Kirner Pils. Another Information Tableau - Beer located in Kirn details Hildegard's book Causae et Curae where she wrote, Drink beer!

ST JOHANNISBERG CHURCH

Situated high on a hill in the town of Hochstetten-Dhaun is the St Johannisberg Church. Declared a collegiate church in 1318, the bulding has seen many additions and renovations. The church also has an abundance of elaborately designed tomb monuments which have been used to trace the development of sculpture from the 14th–18th century. Another treasure is the Stumm organ, built in 1782 by Friedrich Carl Stumm. The Meditation Tableau - Soul and **Body** placed here invites pilgrims to reflect about the soul and body of the human being, and their own life-journey.

Pray: Make me a channel of your peace, O God. Increase in me the spirit of humility. Do: Dedicate yourself to peacemaking. Be the last to argue, the first to reconcile.

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NAHE SKYWALK

A stunning panoramic view of the Nahe Valley and the old stone quarry can been seen from the Nahe Skywalk, a 65-square metre observation deck. In medieval times the need for metals for armaments, swords, and tools increased. In the last book of her *Liber Physica*, Hildegard lists nine metals in hierarchical order – thereby envisioning the formation of metals at the beginning of creation. The Skywalk is the perfect spot for the **Information Tableau – Metals**.

DHAUN CASTLE

The next part of the trail takes you down deep into the forest, passing the Brunkenstein ruin. Found here is the Information Tableau - Reptiles which features Hildegard's book on toads, serpents, dragons, and other primeval and legendary creatures. Next stop is Dhaun Castle (pictured), thought to be one of the biggest complexes of its kind in the Nahe Valley. Built in the 12th century (or earlier), the castle has seen several additions and renovations. Today, it houses the education institution, the Dhaun Castle Academy. At the Dhaun Castle is the **Meditation Tableau** - Hildegard's Music. Here you are encouraged to listen more intently and reflect on her music more deeply.

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SIMMERTAL

Among the highlights of the charming town of Simmertal is the *Natural History Museum* (pictured). It primarily deals with geological history and rocks, but it also has an archaeological collection and holds exhibitions on natural history and birds. At the old town hall find the **Information Tableau – Hildegard's Correspondence** that outlines the vast extent of her letter writing.

On your way to Monzingen, the Hildegard Way takes you through the picturesque old vineyard village of Weiler. Here, you will find the **Information Tableau – Wine.** From there you stop at the town of Monzingen and visit a herb garden where the **Information Tableau – Plants** is placed.

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BAD SOBERNHEIM

Bad Sobernheim is a noted spa town, known for its healing-mud cures. It also has a long Jewish history, with the first known inhabitants dating back to the middle ages. The **Meditation Tableau - The Synagogue** was placed, intentionally, in front of the Malteser chapel (pictured), and not the Synagogue. This was to symbolise that Hildegard's vision does not represent Jewish self-understanding, but merely a Christian perspective on Judaism.

HEIMATMUSEUM

The Heimatmuseum (Local History Museum) in Bad Sobernheim focuses on the naturopath Protestant Pastor Leopold Erdmann Emanuel Felke, whose work laid the foundation for the spa business. Felke, who was born in 1856 and died 1926 in Munich, is buried in Bad Sobernheim as he was active in Bad Sobernheim from 1915 to 1925. Felke developed the Felke Cure which involved clay applications and baths, a healthy diet, outdoor exercise, and sleeping outdoors or in cabins open to the light and air. He also practiced iridology and is considered the co-father of combination homeopathic remedies. Located in the Priorhof of the museum, is the Information Tableau - Medical Herbs.

DISIBODENBERG CHAPEL

Hildegard lived in Disibodenberg for nearly 40 years from 1112– 1150 and falls in the middle of the Pilgrimage Trail. The late gothic *Disibodenberg Chapel* once belonged to the Disibodenberg Monastery. Today, it is been completely renovated and houses a brewery and restaurant (*Denkmalz*). In memory of Hildegard, they serve a beer called *Wilde Ginger* which is made with local brook mint, ginger, and elderberry.

STAUDERNHEIM

Along the Barefoot Path leading to the Nahe River is the Information Tableau - Causae et Curae. After crossing the river Pilgrims head towards Staudernheim. This delightful town boasts a small, but unique museum – the *Participatory* Museum for Nature Conservation. Its primary focus is nature conservation, shown from different points of views: from both nature and humans. It has a large outdoor area, a sanctuary, and a model for modern nature protection. At the museum you will find the Information Tableau - Physica that is dedicted to Hildegard's nature studies.

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STAUDERNHEIM

Staudernheim offers pilgrims two opportunities for meditation. The first, **Meditation Tableau – The Choir of Angels**, is at the baroque *St John the Baptist Catholic Church. This* is a listed building and is protected by the Hague Convention. Built in 1770, it houses an organ made in 1875 by the Stumm organ-building family. It is probably their first organ with a cone chest and sliding chest.

We are called to live the Word ourselves, to say a prophet's word, so that others may live better lives because of us. Otherwise, we use a standard that does not really describe a spiritual person in the Judaeo-Christian tradition. It is little more than camouflage for religious comfort, for making a spa out of the religious life, for confusing a feel-good following of Jesus with the hard work of tending to the world.

STAUDERNHEIM

The next **Meditation Tableau** – **The Redeemer** is located at the neogothic Protestant Church. In front of the church is a beautiful treed square with seating – an ideal spot for meditating!

DISIBODENBERG

The ruins of the Disibondenberg monastery, founded by Saint Disibod, can be found in the Nature Protection Area Disibodenberg. Following the Benedictine takeover in 1107, the Counts of Sponheim sponsored the building of a Frauenklause - a female hermitage - to be associated with the monastery. It was here, on All Saint's Day 1112, that Hildegard took her vows. It became her home for the next 39 years and represents the spiritual centre of the pilgrimage. The Information Tableau – Hildegard's time at the Disibodenberg is located here.

HILDEGARD CHAPEL

DUCHROTH

The next **Meditation Tableau – Ecclesia and Virginitas** is found at the Protestant Church in Duchroth. This church was built between 1908-1910 after the original burnt to ground during a catastropic fire that struck the village in 1905. An interesting quirk of the church is that the clock mechanism has to be wound up by hand every day!

OBERHAUSEN ON THE NAHE

The next Meditation Tableau -Christ and His Church is located as you enter the grounds of the Protestant Church in Oberhausen. This Gothic Revival building made of standstone was built 1865-1868. Pilgrims then leave the town via the landmark Luitpold Bridge. This historic sandstone, arched bridge was built in 1889 to make it easier for winegrowers to reach the trading houses in Bad Kreuznach. Prior to crossing the bridge is the Information Tableau - Fish where we learn of Hildegard's dedication to studying fish life and local rivers.

SCHLOßBÖCKELHEIM

In 1105 Schloßböckelheim was the site of a major historic event. Henry IV, Holy Roman Emperor, was imprisoned at the Böckelheim Castle by his son to force him to abdicate. The son succeeded and became Henry V. The castle was destroyed by the French in 1168. Located at the site of the ruins is the **Information Tableau** - **Böckelheim Castle** and the **Meditation Tableau – The Devil** where Hildegard envisions the powers of evil and their conquests.

THIS CUP WE BLESS A Tea and Coffee Break for Every Day During Lent Michael McGirr

WALDBÖCKELHEIM

Outside St Bartholomäus Catholic Church, built between 1833-1836, is the Meditation Tableau - God. Lucifer, and Humanity which relates to Hildegard's third book of Scivias. This tableau is about the cosmic drama that took place at the beginning of time according to Hildegard. The next Information Tableau - The Tithe, is found at the old tithe barn and reminds pilgrims that Hildegard was dedicated to God as a 'tithe'. A tithe was the name given to the obligatory contribution by lay people to the Church of a 10th of their income or the equivialent in crops, stock, etc. Hildegard was the tenth child of noble parents, and we are told, that while praying, they offered her to God as a 'tithe'.

WALDBÖCKELHEIM

Still in Waldböckelheim, but at the top of the hill, is the town's landmark Protestant Church. This sandstone, neo-gothic style church was built between 1863 and 1867. The Church's organ, which is historical listed, was built in 1866 by the organ builders Anton and Carl Christian Weil. It is one of the most important examples of romantic organ building in the Rhineland. This position, high above the countryside, is the perfect place for the **Meditation** Tableau - The Edifice of Salvation, which explains Hildegard's concept of the City of God.

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BURGSPONHEIM

The trail now heads towards historic Hildegard sites that connect to her teacher, *Jutta of Sponheim*. The first stop is at the ruins of *Sponheim Castle* in Burgsponheim where Jutta and her family lived. Here pilgrims will find the **Information Tableau – Jutta of Sponheim** and the **Meditation Tableau – The Tower of Anticipation** where you can listen to Hildegard's favourite song that she wrote, *O virga ac diadema* (Sequence for the Virgin). SPONHEIM

The Parish Church of St Martin (Sponheim Minster) is important for the Hildegard Way as it is the only remaining building from the era in which Hildegard lived - the 12th century. It is also important because Abbot John Trithemius, who was the most well known abbot of the monastery, venerated Hildegard and constantly referred to her in his historical writings. It was Trithemius who contributed to Hildegard's posthumous fame. Here you will find two tableaux, the Information Tableau – Sponheim Minister and the Meditation Tableau - The Pillar of the Word of **God** where Hildegard's vision of a pillar with three sides is explained.

The Ten Commandments are as relevant today as when they were first written down. Their purpose was to help the people maintain good relationships with God and their neighbours.

BRAUNWEILER

The next stop on the Hildegard Way is at the *St Joseph Catholic Church* in Braunweiler where the **Meditation Tableau – The Zeal of God in Braunweiler** is located. From here pilgrims head towards Dalberg where they will see many wayside crosses along the way. This shows that they are moving – culturally, speaking – from the rather Protestant Western Naheland to more deeply into the Catholic Soonwald region.

During Lent include those who are alone. There are elderly people who have no family, parents whose children are far away, couples who are separated, and those who are alone because of family problems. Be alert to those people and include them in your Lenten and Easter celebrations.

DALBERG

The special focus of this stage of the trail is Mary. Halfway to Dalberg is a junction called Keber's Kreuz (Cross). Here you will find the Information Tableau -Hildegard's Marian Songs. 21 of the 27 songs gathered in Hildegard's Symphonia harmoniae caelestium revelationum are dedicated to Mary. Upon arriving at the small town of Dalberg the next stop is St Leonard's Chapel. Built in 1485, this late-gothic, aisleless Church is among the village's most historically important buildings. The bells are still rung by hand! The the Meditation Tableau - The Stone Wall of the Old Law is located here.

DALBURG CASTLE RUINS

On the way to the Dalburg Castle ruins is a Baroque *Marian Column* marked 1728 dedicated to Mary. For many, this has been a site of rest and for praying the *Hail Mary*. Dalburg Castle was built circa 1150 to 1170. It was mostly destroyed in the wars of 1635 and 1689. Remaining today, are the Romanesque keep, residential quarters, 'long hall', and the the 14th century Saint Anthony's Chapel – the of location of the *Meditation Tableau – The Pillar of the Trinity*.

The starkness of the community chapel is simply an external reminder of the internal emptiness that develops when we barter the real richness of life for the trinkets of living.

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SPABRÜCKEN

Spabrücken is an old pilgrimage site famous for the sculpture Black Madonna of Soon (Soon being the name of the forest that surrounds Spabrücken). Over the centuries the sculpture was damaged so often that in 1909, the sculptor Kaspar Weiß created a new Mother of God of the Soon into whose interior the old statue was inserted. This sculpture stands in the Mary's Assumption Church which dates back to 1359. Its interior is dominated by a high altar which reaches up to the ceiling. Both the Information Tableau – Pilgrimage and the Meditation Tableau - The **Pillar of the Savior's Humanity** are located here.

SCHÖNEBERG

From Spabrücken to Schöneberg you will follow, what locals recently created, the Path of the Three Madonnas. The first was the Black Madonna of Soon in Spabrücken which they linked to the topic of 'faith'. The second Madonna, linked to 'love', is noted at the Eremitage on the road to Schöneberg where there are wooden Stations of the Cross, but unfortunately, the Madonna-figure is missing. Also here is the **Meditation Tableau** - The Tower of the Church. At the Finding of the Cross Catholic Church in Schöneberg is a post-war photocopy of the third Madonna - Madonna of Stalingrad (pictured) linked to 'hope'. ST JAKOBUS CHURCH STROMBERG

On the way to Stromberg, pilgrims pass through the holiday village of Schindeldorf. Here, at the Information Tableau - Libre Vitae Meritorum we learn about Hildegard's second theological work about the destructive and constructive powers of humans. From here, the beautiful landscape of the Soonwald Trail leads to the delightful town of Stromberg and the St Jakobus Catholic Church. Built in 1863 from Stromberger limestone it houses a large old crucifix and precious sacred objects from the years 1715 and 1739. Inside the church is the **Meditation** Tableau - The Last Days and the Fall of the Antichrist which focuses on Hildegard's apocalyptic visions.

The last meditation tableau of the the Hildegard way, *Meditation Tableau - Symphony of Praise* references Hildegard hearing of celestial music, and is found at the end of the *RuheForst Waldalgesheirm*. A RuheForst is an eco-friendly alternative to a cemetery. Biodegradable urns are placed in places such as trees, large stones, bushes, and rhizomes. This is the perfect spot to rest, meditate, or listen to Hildegard's *O gloriosissimi lux* (Antiphon to the Angels).

BINGEN

The next stage of the Hildegard pilgrimage takes pilgrims to the city of Bingen, where in around 1150, Hildegard founded her first Abbey. Here, the Cultural Office of the City of Bingen has a marked tour of the 17 most important Hildegard sites. The last three Hildegard of Bingen Pilgrimage Tableaux are displayed along this route. The **Information** Tableau – Bingen, the Hildegard-Town is found at the first stop, the Museum am Strom. This museum was once a power station dating back from 1898 and holds a permanent exhibition on Hildegard.

BINGEN

At the St Rupert and St Hildegard Church is the Information Tableau - Liber Divinorum Operum, the last of her works which she completed in her 70s. It is divided into three parts - the cosmos and the human person, rewards for virtue and punishment for vice, and, the history of salvation. Within the transept of the church are artistically designed windows depicting the life and work of Hildegard. A bronze sculpture by Karl-Heinz Oswald adorns the church forecourt. Located a few blocks away from this Church at Am Rupertsberg 16 is what would have been the actual site of Hildegard's monastery. The Information Tableau - The Rupertsberg Women's Monastery is located here.

BINGEN

The building of Hildegard's first monastery at Rupertsberg – where she wrote most of her works – began in 1150. Sadly, it was virtually destroyed in 1632 amid the *Thirty Years' War*. The nuns returned in 1636, but the buildings were inhabitable, so they sought refuge at the daughter monastery in Eibingen. In the 19th century the *St Rochus Chapel* was decorated with altars and pictures from the monastery church in Eibingen and the altar contains two Hildegard relics. The final tableau, *Information Tableau – After Hildegard's Death*, is located here.

The Church's synodal form... suggests that Lent is also a time of ... decisions, small and large ... Decisions capable of altering the daily lives of individuals and entire neighbourhoods, such as the ways we acquire goods, care for creation, and strive to include those who go unseen or are looked down upon. EIBINGEN, RÜDESHEIM

The Abbey of St Hildegard is seen as the most important destination for Hildegard pilgrims. However, the Parish Church of St Hildegard located just below the Abbey was built on the site where, in 1165, Hildegard established her second monastery (her daughter convent). Spiritually, this is the real destination of the pilgrimage way. Inside the Church, in front of a wonderful wall mosaic that depicts Hildegard's vision of the Trinity, is Hildegard's shrine containing her remains.

RÜDESHEIM ABBEY OF ST HILDEGARD

The Abbey of St Hildegard, which looks over the village of Eibingen, is located within the UNESCO World Heritage listed Upper Middle Rhine Valley. Although appearing Romanesque, it was built between 1900-1904. The original Eibingen monastery closed in 1803 as part of secularisation. During the late 19th century, a plan for a new monastery to revitalise the old Eibingen convent and hark back to the old Rupertsberg was devised. On 17 September 1904, 14 Benedictine nuns from St Gabriel in Prague moved into the new foundation. Thus, marking the beginning of the Benedictine community that exists today, and who still see themselves as the founding of St Hildegard, the tradition of their house is directly linked to her old monastery in Eibingen.

Jesus, risen from the tomb, help us appreciate the places where we have come to know and love you. Mark them in the memory of our hearts, and as we revisit them in mind or in person, may we be refreshed in our commitment to live as people of the resurrection.

31 MARCH 2024 EASTER SUNDAY

ST HILDEGARD OF BINGEN

Hildegard died on 17 September 1179 at the age of 81 in the Rupertsberg monastery. She left a vast array of works: three volumes of visionary theology; two books on natural science and medicine; one of the largest bodies of letters (nearly 400) to survive from the Middle Ages; an invented language called the Lingua Ignota (unknown language); over 70 songs; a musical play, Ordo Virtutum (The Order of Virtues); biographies of Saints Rupert and Disibod; plus many minor works. A statue of Hildegard by Karlheinz Oswald stands out the front of the Abbey of St Hildegard.

Almighty and ever-living God, Today we rejoiced in the gift of salvation. Fill our hearts with the joy of the resurrection, and grant us abundant love so that we may, like the women at the tomb, run gladly to tell the Good News. Through Christ our Lord, Amen
