My first stop was part of a spirituality day at the Our Lady of the Cape Primary School in Dunsborough near Margaret River - yep hard to take! I was impressed with the 'thirst' of staff for an MJR refresher and ways of finding to Make Jesus Real. The wonderful Assistant Principal, Amie Meyer shared the following reflections:

- 1. Loved the way Marty aligned the principles of MJR to our school vision, values, and promise, as well as to CEWA's Wellbeing Framework which is a focus in our School Improvement Plan.
- 2. It was made clear that MJR can be used as a complementary reinforcement of our RE Curriculum plus other subject areas such as HPE - it was palpable and contagious.
- 3. It was a timely and necessary reinvigoration of the 'why' and 'how' and certainly opened up a great conversation about how we can make MJR even more effective at our school and in our community.
- 4. The Spirit of Jesus was present throughout our day and Marty truly tuned us in to looking for ways to make Jesus real to our staff and students in 2024. It was both a professional and personal day.


Explanation of the theme and prayers to use are sent to teachers and placed in the school's newsletter.




MJR AWARD

William McInnes – actor and writer whose latest book Yeah, Nah! is about 'I accept your proposition but I don't agree'.

MITCH'S TRAVELS

Peter (Mitch) Mitchell recently joined with Ray Smith from Larmenier Catholic School, Launceston in presenting an MJR inspired in-service day to Holy Rosary School, Doubleview, WA. Ray was on a 'fact finding mission' on how 'they do MJR/SOJ' in Perth. We thought it worthy to highlight some of Ray's reflections, including:

- » The realisation that students have the Spirit of Jesus in their hearts and that they can recognise this in themselves and others.
- » Sharing the prayer of Saint Theresa of Avila (1515) with a class of Grade 5 students and discussing what is meant by 'Jesus has no body but mine...' and Mitch bringing this prayer "alive" and "relevant" in 2024.
- » OH YEAH moments were also a favourite to witness.
- » Meeting Representatives from CEWA and being able to talk candidly with them as a practitioner of MJR.

- » Meeting other practitioners working in groups from Kinder to Grade 6. Sharing ideas and better ways to set students alive with the Spirit of Jesus.
- » And it makes no difference if it is Tasmania, WA or Queensland, the message is the same – there are God Moments all around us, all of the time - we just have to be open to them!

Whilst in Perth, Mitch met with Mark Powell, Ben Bull, and Keely Trouchet at Catholic Education Western Australia to explore how the 'MJR way of life' can benefit WA school communities. If you are in WA, stay tuned for more information on the outcomes of those discussions in future Bulletins.


