Authority:


"In a synodal Church, the Synod of Bishops is only the most evident manifestation of a **dynamism of communion** which inspires all ecclesial decisions."


Why Synods?


Synodal Participation








Provoking statements for group discussion

- 1. For too long the laity have been considered spectators or docile children, instead of being built up as mature Christians priestly, prophetic and royal in their responsibility for the mission of the Church.
- 2. Synodality revives the central meaning of *transformation* for today's Church. Synodality is preparation for, and participation in, transformation of oneself, one's community, and the world through love.
- 3. It is a journey, Spirit-led, and a path of commitment to conversion. Hence the importance of the promotion and development of synodality amongst the entire People of God.
